Catholic Education Week Theme: Igniting Hope

Throughout Catholic Education Week, we ask you to reflect on the significance of Catholic education's presence and contribution in our Church, and in our society.

Friday: A Future Full of Hope

St. Veronica highlights Catholic Education week through school wide prayers that reflect the five sub themes: Our Hope in Christ, The Hope Within Us, The Hope Among Us, Hope for the World and A Future Full of Hope.

Teachers will address each of the sub themes in their classrooms through a variety of lessons/activities, class liturgies and prayer. We will celebrate a school wide retreat day and each division will be involved in events that highlight the week's themes. Parents are always welcome to join us for all the school wide presentation/events that will take place during Catholic Education Week.

Faith Formation:

Forming ourselves in our Catholic faith is a foundational element in helping each of us understand and live in the example of Christ.

Dufferin-Peel has had a long supported Adult Faith Formation. Teachers are encouraged to develop their faith through a number of Board-Wide initiatives and professional development opportunities such as When Faith Meets Pedagogy Conference. At the MBC Family level, teachers are gather for Advent and Lenten Celebrations. In our school, the Adult Faith Team invites colleagues to prayer services held on the First Friday of every month.

Our morning announcements will include scripture that students can discuss in class and reflect upon that is relevant to the day/event/season.

The Youth Faith Ambassadors is a program that invites students from grades 7-8 to become faith leaders in our school. From social justice initiatives such as planning food drives and our Angels on the Tree hat-mitten-scarf and gift drive to faith formation of the school by leading retreats, the YFAs play a vital role in the faith development of our school. Together teachers and students will break bread and discuss current issues facing our youth, our country and our world through the eyes of our faith. The MBC Family of Schools also organizes a Youth Faith Ambassador Retreat Day to celebrate the contributions these young adults have made in our schools.

Sacramental Preparation:

As Catholics, we understand sacraments to be "outward signs instituted by Christ to give grace." Together in partnership with our parish, we support the preparation of God's children in receiving the sacraments.

Recognizing Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations:

Framed by the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations (OCSGE), our graduates will be effective communicators, reflective thinkers, lifelong learners, collaborative contributors, caring family members, responsible citizens and discerning believers formed in the Catholic faith community.

The St. Veronica community uses the OCSGE as a framework to ensure that we are providing our students with the knowledge, skills and values they need to respond to God's call to go out into the world and live the Gospel values.

The OCSGE are an integral part of daily programing, the work we do around creating successful pathways through our All About Me Portfolios/My Blueprint, and various leadership experiences we provide through our Youth Faith Ambassadors Program, and Eco Team.

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

Students are involved in Classroom liturgies and activities that highlight each month's virtue. We recognize 2-3 students in each class who have demonstrated the virtue of the month. Announcements highlight the Virtues and remind students of what they look like, feel like and sound like in the classroom and in the schoolyard.

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

St. Veronica staff and students respond to the call to service, through active participation in a variety of outreach and social justice activities. St. Veronica strives to be a welcoming and inclusive environment and all are welcomed and greeted with kindness. We ensure that our foyer and classrooms reflect the liturgical year with liturgical colours and symbols of our faith. Hallways have posters and pictures of faith, virtues and student created paintings that represent the Ontario Catholic Graduate Expectations. Each school day, and all meetings begin with a prayer or liturgy of the word. All students play an active role in the faith life of the school.
