
World Teachers' Day





A reflective, creative and holistic thinker who solves problems and makes responsible decisions with an informed moral conscience for the common good.


A self-directed, responsible life-long learner who develops and demonstrates God-given potential.

Opening School Mass


Our Opening School Mass will take place on Wednesday, October 4 at 10:00 am. It will be a beautiful gathering of our school community. All are welcome to attend.

Are You Ticked?

Catholic Ratepayers - check your tax bill to ensure proper tax support

If you are a Catholic ratepayer, we urge you to check your property tax bill to ensure that your support is directed to your local Catholic School Board, in our case, the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board. If you are a tenant, you can verify your support by contacting our Admissions Department at 905-890-0708, ext. 24512 or 24519, or your local Municipal Office. By ensuring that you are accurately recorded as a Catholic school supporter, you can help deliver a powerful message to the government about the level of support for publicly-funded Catholic education in Ontario.



Also, in order to be eligible to vote for your local Catholic school board Trustee, you must be registered as a separate school supporter.



Reporting Student Absences

Daily attendance and punctuality is important. As in the past, we ask that you inform the school on the days your child will be absent.

This is a safety precaution that can save precious moments should there ever be an emergency situation. Thank you to all parents who have been calling the school and using the Safe Arrival website or app when your child has been absent due to an illness or an appointment.

To use the Safe Arrival School Messenger program, use the link provided below or you can down load and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store. Please note that SafeArrival uses the SchoolMessenger app.

Bringing Your Child to School

It is wonderful to see so many parents and guardians accompany their children to school. We kindly remind you that you should remain outside school yard boundaries and to keep the pathways clear for students to enter the yard. We thank you for your assistance in making our school a place where students feel welcome and safe.



We would also like to remind parents and guardians that school supervision does not begin until 8:15 am. Students should not be arriving before this time, as they will not be supervised.



First Aid

Students often come to the office for bumps and scrapes from falls or trips outside, in the gym or in the classroom. Whenever first aid is given, we will call families to let them know what has happened and what aid they received. If we are unable to reach you, we will leave a message.

Students will also often come to the office for some TLC and magic ice from Mrs. Magi. For these visits, we will absolutely give students what they need, but we will not be calling home.

If you have any concerns, please contact the office.

Custody of Children

On rare occasions, we are faced with difficult situations in which non-custodial parents arrive at the school asking to visit their child or to take their child home after school.

We are best able to serve and protect students when we are made aware of legal custody arrangements, visitation rights, and other special instructions.

If legal custody matters affect your family, please ensure that our office and classroom teachers are aware of custodial arrangements between parents that may affect your child during school hours. Please ensure that a copy of the court order is on file at the school office.



Safety in the Gym

Students are reminded that they must wear proper indoor shoes for gym and appropriate gym clothing. Jewelry must be removed when in gym class or during sports activities. Students are not permitted to wear their 'outdoor' shoes in the gym.

Cyber-Safety

The internet can be a great resource for children and adults. They can use it to research, communicate with others, and play interactive games. Sometimes that access can pose hazards. One area that we are seeing an increase is abuse in the use of social media. That is why it is important to be aware of what your children see and hear on the internet, who they meet, and what they share about themselves online. Just like any safety issue, it is wise to



talk with your children about your concerns, take advantage of resources to protect them, and keep a close eye on their activities.

Bikes, Scooters and Rollerblades: Safety First



A safety reminder to all students that bikes, scooters and roller blades are to be walked both on and off the school property. Bikes are to be locked in the bike racks. We do not have facilities to store or secure roller blades or scooters, so there is an added risk of damage or theft and they are not encouraged to be brought to school. The school is not responsible for these items. Your cooperation is appreciated.

Kiss and Ride

Thank you to all of the parents who have helped the morning kiss and ride be so successful. We appreciate how drivers continue to pull as far forward as possible before letting students out. When using the kiss n ride, please ensure that your children exit the vehicle on the right side. The left side lane is a drive thru lane and can present a safety issue for students exiting on the left.



For those parents who park and walk their children to their respective yards, we remind you that it is important to model for them how /where to cross traffic safely.

We thank you for your continued support in making our kiss & ride a safe and effective process.



Allergies/Anaphylactic Shock

St. Veronica is an allergen aware school. We have a number of students in our school who have severe allergic life-threatening reactions to peanuts, peanut butter, peanut oils, any peanut/nut by-products and dairy products. As in the past, we are asking you to not put any child at risk, therefore, are requesting that peanuts, peanut butter, peanut oils, any peanut/nut by-product not be brought into the school. We ask that you read the labels of all food items sent to school

A letter was sent home in September which addressed this issue for each particular class. We are asking parents/guardians not to send food items to school when celebrating your child's birthday. We thank you for your continued understanding.

Parents are responsible for ensuring that all medication and forms are updated annually. If your child requires medication, please have all pertinent forms completed and returned with the medication to the office as soon as possible. Please see the office or link below for the necessary form to be filled out.



JK/SK medications are stored in the classroom.

Students in grades 1 - 8 are required to carry their own medication in a fanny pack. If you wish to submit additional medication to the office, please send it as soon as possible.

Please ensure your child is sent to school with his/her medication.



Student Illness

Peel Public Health has recommended to stay home when students are feeling sick. Students who are ill should be kept at home where they are most comfortable and can get better sooner. A child who is too ill to go out for recess is too ill to be at school. Keeping students at home who are unwell is also appreciated as we do want others to be exposed to illness or communicable diseases. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Emergency Procedures

Each and every school within Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board is required to have a fire emergency and evacuation plan. We are required under Board Policy to have three practice 'fire drills' during the first term. The classroom teachers have and will continue to review these procedures with their students. We are also required to review 'Hold and Secure' and practice 'Lockdown' ar



also required to review 'Hold and Secure' and practice 'Lockdown' and 'Shelter in Place' procedures. We will continue practicing these drills throughout the school year. Teachers will be assuring their children that this is strictly a practice. Please be assured that we always have the safety of our children as our first concern.

Bus Loading Zone

Please be reminded that the front of the school is designated as a "Bus Loading Zone." Parents/guardians are not permitted to pick up or drop off students in this zone. The safety of our students is our priority. Please drop off or pick up students in the designated school parking lot or the Kiss and Ride area.

School Bus Safety

The conduct of individual students on the bus directly affects the safety of all the students on the bus. The driver's attention needs to be on the road. If students are misbehaving, this can distract the driver.

We are requesting that all parents/guardians reinforce the <u>School</u> <u>Bus Safety Rules</u> with their child(ren).



Students should:

- Be at the bus stop 5-10 minutes prior to their stop time. Never play close to the road. Be ready to board the bus by waiting in an orderly line.
- Board the bus in a single file, use the handrail and sit down in their seat as quickly as possible.

- Listen to the bus driver.
- Always remain seated while the bus is moving.
- Do not throw anything around the bus or out of the window.
- Keep the aisles clear of all objects (backpacks, lunches, books, feet, etc.).
- Do not shout. Be especially quiet at railway crossings.
- Never put any part of your body out an open window.
- Be sure to look all ways before crossing the road.
- Do not damage the bus in any way.
- Do not throw garbage on the floor.
- Do not consume any food or drink on the bus.

If students fail to follow the bus safety rules, the student may lose their bus privilege.



Courtesy Seats

We have begun to accept requests for courtesy seats. If you would like to apply for a seat on a current bus route, please submit TFL004 from stopr.ca to Mrs. Magi by October 11, 2024.

Once STOPR has approved the requests, families will be notified when their request can be accommodated.

We are not always able to accommodate all of the requests. We are encouraging all students to walk to and from school with a friend. We thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Dental Screening at St. Veronica

Peel Public Health will be conducting dental screenings for students in JK, SK, Grade 2, Grade 4, and Grade 7 at **St. Veronica on Thursday, November 14, 2024**.



What is a dental screening?

- A dental screening is a quick look in the child's mouth by a registered dental hygienist using a no-touch technique.
- A separate, sterilized mouth mirror is used for each child.
- A dental screening identifies children who may need dental care.

What happens after a school dental screening?

- A form with the results of the dental screening will go home with every child screened.
- If a child is identified with a dental condition requiring immediate dental treatment, an additional form will be attached for parents to fill in and return to Peel Public Health. Please read the form(s) carefully.

Prior to any child receiving the free dental screening, DPCDSB requires parent/guardian consent. Consent forms have been sent home to families already. Please complete the form and return it to your child's teacher as soon as possible.

Catholic Code of Conduct

Throughout the year, school expectations, with a focus on safety, respect, and responsibility will be reviewed with students. These expectations, based on the Catholic Code of Conduct, are reviewed



and reinforced by teachers in the classrooms. We kindly ask that you review these policies found in the front pages of the student agenda with your child(ren) to ensure consistent expectations at home and school.

The student agenda is a useful communication tool between home and school should you have any questions or concerns to be addressed by your child's teacher.



Routine Vaccines for Students in Grades 7 and 8

Routine Vaccines for Students in Grades 7-12 - It Takes a Village Every year, Peel Public Health teams up with schools and parents to make sure students get their important vaccines. As part of the Ontario immunization routine schedule, Grade 7 students aged 11

or older are eligible for their routine vaccines. Students can get Hepatitis B (HB), Human Papillomavirus (HPV-9), and Meningitis (Men-C-ACYW) vaccines. These vaccines are safe, have been used for a long time and help keep everyone healthy!

Vaccinations: A Shared Responsibility

Starting in the fall, vaccination clinics will be set up in schools to help students stay on track and get these vaccines for free The goal is to make sure all students get their vaccines before they complete Grade 8.

For Parents: Keeping Your Child Healthy

If your child is in Grade 7 or 8, the vaccine clinic will take place on **Tuesday, November 26, 2024**. You will also get an immunization fact sheet and a paper consent form to sign.

The Online Reporting Tool

The Online Reporting Tool was designed to promote a positive school climate and is intended for students who become aware of bullying incidents and negative behaviours impacting the school community. While students are encouraged to report to a staff member in person at school, there may be unique situations the

online option is preferred. Simply 'click' on the link below and answer eight questions. The report will be emailed directly to the school's principal and vice principal.

Board Policy on Personal Electronic Devices

It is the policy of the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board that school community members are to refrain from using their PEDs unless directed to do so by an educator, or for health, medical and/or special education needs.



Students in Kindergarten to Grade 6 must now keep their phones turned off or set to silent mode and out of sight for the school day, unless otherwise allowed by the educator during instructional time for a specific purpose.

Students in Grades 7 to 12 must store their phones out of view and powered off or set to silent mode during instructional time, unless otherwise explicitly allowed by the educator during instructional time for a specific purpose.

Students who need to use their phones or other electronic devices for health and medical reasons, e.g., glucose monitoring, medication administration reminders, etc., or to support specific special education needs, may continue to use them during the school day following consultation with school administration.

Contravention of these Ministry of Education expectations will be addressed according to the procedures outlined within DPCDSB's Catholic Code of Conduct.

Did you know?

- Car Transportation is responsible for 26% of greenhouse pollution.
- Canadians on average use more energy than any other country in the world and one of the reasons is due to our reliance on motor vehicles.
- Greater pedestrian traffic can help reduce noise pollution. Noise pollution affects the health of the environment and people, and can discourage wildlife and vegetation from coming into urban areas.
